- Charitable lead trusts: May reduce beneficiaries' taxes by having the trust contribute to charity for a specified period of time, with the trust assets returning to the trustor or heirs.
- Charitable remainder trusts: Designed to provide income and, in many
  cases, tax savings to the trustor and spouse, with the assets remaining after
  death passing to designated charities.
- Grantor retained annuity trusts (GRATs): After providing a donor with an annuity for a fixed time, assets pass to the beneficiaries (who must be family members).
- Irrevocable life insurance trusts: Enable life insurance policy holders to avoid estate taxes on policy benefits.
- Qualified personal residence trusts: Used to transfer a grantor's residence out of the grantor's estate in a tax-advantageous manner.
- **Revocable living trusts:** Often used to avoid probate and plan for future mental incompetency and disability while an individual is alive.
- **Supplemental needs trusts:** Preferred vehicle to meet the needs of disabled children.
- Testamentary trusts: Created to provide for minor children.
- Trust and Estate Administration: Representation of trust and estate beneficiaries and fiduciaries (i.e. Trustees and Personal Representatives).
